

CMBL – Editorial Policy

Scope

Cellular & Molecular Biology Letters publishes reports on novel investigations in all areas of cell and molecular biology, and also in the fields of biochemistry, biophysics and biotechnology. It encourages the submission of articles on studies where findings are at the interface of cellular and molecular biology, including but not limited to cellular compartments, the cell cycle and its regulation, cell differentiation, stem cells, cell traffic, signaling, motility, adhesion and division, the cellular membranes, the cytoskeleton, nuclear architecture, gene expression, and molecular biotechnology. The language of the journal is English. Each volume consists of four issues.

CMBL publishes:

- a) Research Articles
- b) Communications - short reports on new and exciting results of high urgency
- c) Reviews - topical mini(reviews) as well as full critical reviews on important subjects reflecting new trends are also included in this section

Manuscript submission

Manuscripts preferred for publication in CMBL are those which:

1. Contain original work - which is not published elsewhere in any medium by the authors or anyone else, and is not under consideration for publication in any other medium. This restriction does not apply to review articles.
2. Are focused on the core aims and scope of the journal - CMBL is a scientific journal publishing fundamental research results in all areas of cell and molecular biology, and also in the fields of biochemistry, biophysics and biotechnology.
3. Are clearly and correctly written - should contain all essential features of a complete scientific paper, should be written in a clear, easy to understand manner, and be readable for a wide audience of biologists.
4. Are written in English - should be clearly and grammatically written, in an easily readable style. Attention to detail of the language will avoid severe misunderstandings which might lead to rejection of the paper (Please note that authors who are not native-speakers of English can be provided with help in rewriting their contribution in correct English)
5. Are delivered in electronic format

Manuscripts should be submitted via the **EDIttool** – an online submission system available at <http://www.cmbi.editool.com>. Authors should register themselves first as new users and then upload their manuscripts along with a covering letter. In case of any problems manuscripts can be emailed directly to the Editorial Office (cmbi@cmbi.org.pl).

The **covering letter** should contain all important details about the submission such as: Your full name (submitted by), the full title of your article, full list of authors, e-mail address and contact address, telephone/fax numbers, number of attached files, details of any previous or concurrent submission, area you would like to submit your manuscript in, recommendations of reviewers for Editor.

Experiments involving humans or laboratory animals

When submitting a manuscript in which the Authors report on experiments involving humans or laboratory animals, both in their cover letter and in the Materials and Methods chapter of the manuscript, the Authors must confirm that they have adhered to the legal requirements of the country in which the study was conducted.

Peer review process

All manuscripts directly uploaded to the EDIttool receive individual identification codes. The Managing Editor then sends it to an appropriate Editor. However a submission may be declined by the Managing Editor without review, if deemed inappropriate for reasons other than scientific merit.

The Editors of CMBL seek advice from experts of in the appropriate field. Research articles and communications are reviewed by a minimum of two reviewers, review papers by at least three. Authors are requested to suggest persons competent to review their manuscript. However please note that this will be treated only as a suggestion, and the final selection of reviewers is exclusively the Editor's decision.

The Editors are fully responsible for decisions about manuscripts. The final decision whether to accept or reject a paper rests with them. Corresponding author receives final decision, and information about further processing of the manuscript.

Revised manuscript submission

When revision of a manuscript is requested, authors should return the revised version of their manuscript as soon as possible. Prompt action may ensure fast publication if a paper is finally accepted for publication in CMBL. If it is the first revision of an article authors need to return their revised

manuscript within 60 days. If it is the second revision authors need to return their revised manuscript within 14 days. If these deadlines are not met, and no specific arrangements for completion have been made with the Editor, the manuscript will be treated as a new one and will receive a new identification code along with a new registration date.

Final proofreading

Authors will receive a pdf file with the edited version of their manuscript for final proofreading. This is the last opportunity to view an article before its publication. No changes or modifications can be introduced once it is published. Thus authors are requested to check their proof pages carefully against manuscript within 3 working days and prepare a separate document containing all changes that should be introduced. Authors are sometimes asked to provide additional comments and explanations in response to remarks and queries from the language or technical editors.

Online first

Manuscripts accepted for publication are published on-line using Online First service as soon as they are ready for publication (that is when final proofreading is performed by authors, and all concerns are resolved). Final manuscripts for publication may appear on the Web 1-2 months prior to regular issue publication. Once a manuscript appears on the Web site it is considered as published.

Reprints

After the issue publication, the corresponding author is notified by email, and receives a pdf file with the published version of the manuscript, and free printed reprints are sent by regular mail.

Errata

If any errors are detected in the published material they should be reported to the Managing Editor. The corresponding authors should send appropriate corrected material to the Managing Editor via email. This material will be considered for publication in the earliest available issue of CMBL.

Transfer of Copyright Agreement

A properly completed Transfer of Copyright Agreement form must be provided for each submitted manuscript. A form is sent automatically from the EDIttool upon a new manuscript submission. Transfer of Copyrights Agreement should be signed and sent to the Editorial Office to the address listed below:

Charges

It is anticipated that the page charge per printed page + postage fee for free reprints will be paid by the authors. However, payment of the charge is not a condition of publication, in particular for research which was not supported by an external grant source. Colour illustrations will be published at the author's expense and it cannot be a subject of waiver. It is expected that all figures submitted in colour will be published in colour, i.e. it is not possible to change from colour to b&w or vice versa after manuscript evaluation. The actual prices are available from www.cmbl.org.pl. The main author will receive 50 free offprints and also free pdf version of the paper.
